

MONTHLY CRIME REVIEW FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 2011

1. **TOTAL CRIME:** The total number of IPC and non-IPC cases registered during the month of DECEMBER, 2011 was 48 IPC cases and 407 non-IPC cases showing a slight incline in the IPC and non-IPC cases as compared to the previous two months as depicted in figure 'A' below. The district wise IPC and non-IPC crime is shown in the two pie charts below:-

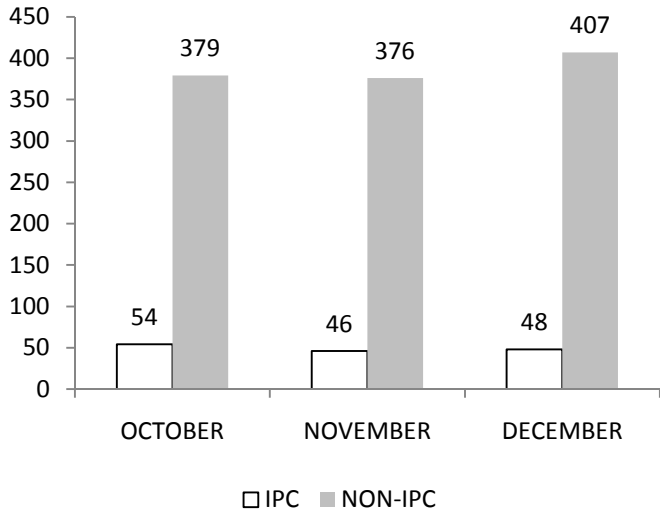
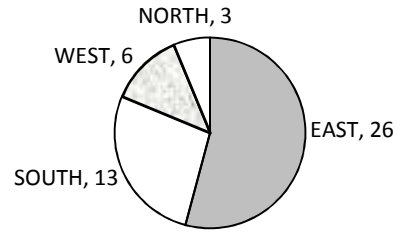
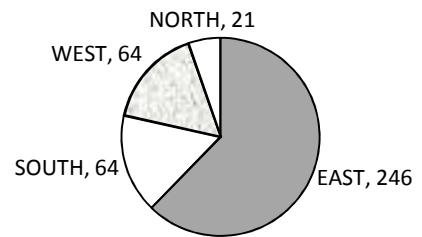

IPC CASES (DECEMBER 2011)

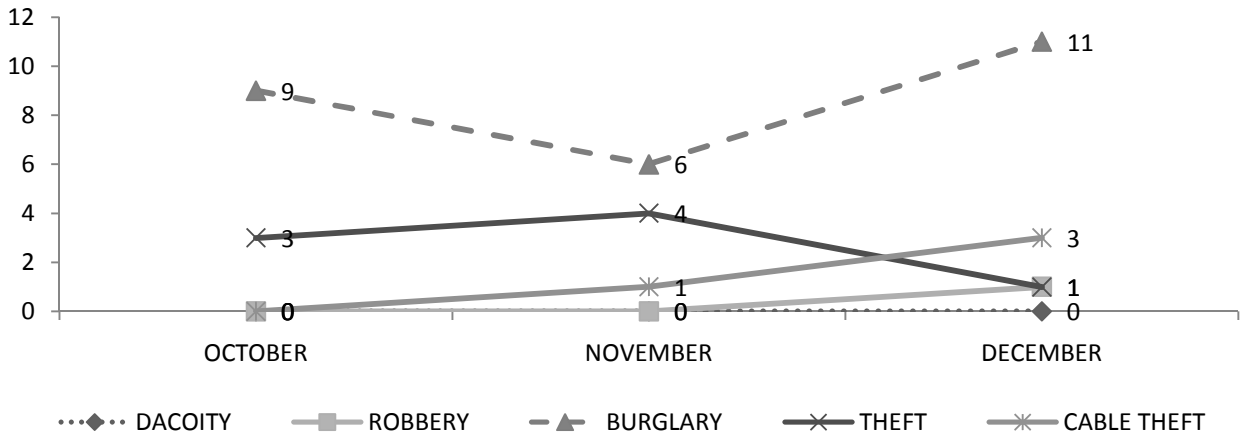


NON-IPC CASES (DECEMBER 2011)

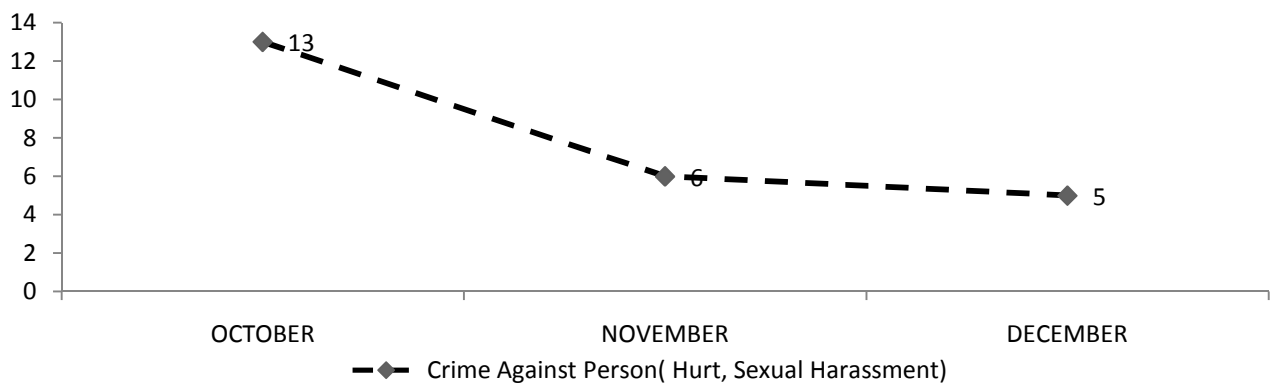


2. **PROPERTY CRIME AND CRIME AGAINST PERSONS :**

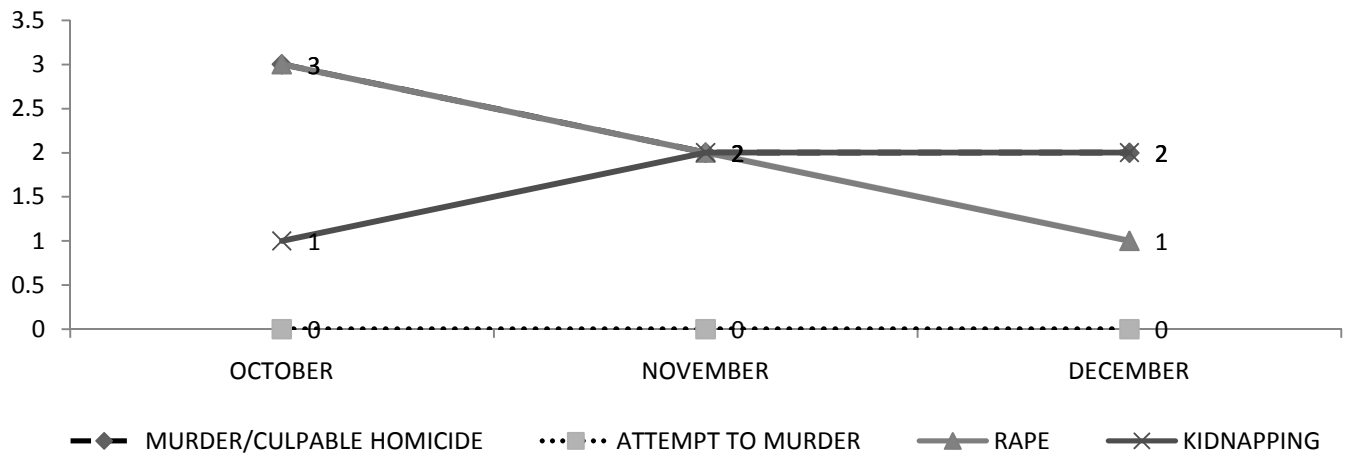
a) Property Crime has shown a marginal increase with 16 cases as compared to 11 cases in November and 12 cases in October this year. The trends in respect of dacoity, robbery, burglary and theft, in particular cable theft are shown below:-



b) In respect of crime against person only 05 cognisable cases were registered during the month which is low as compared to the previous month:-

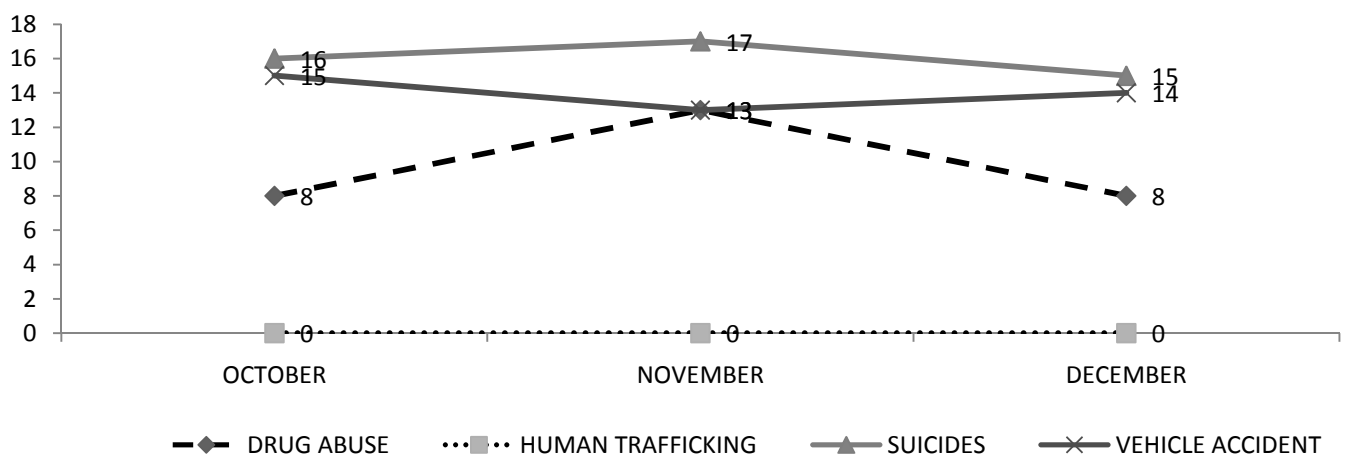


3. HEINOUS CRIME (Murders, Culpable Homicide, Attempt to Murder, Rape and Kidnapping) : The total number of heinous crime cases during DECEMBER, 2011 was 03 – showing decline trend as compared to previous two months.



4. PROFESSIONAL CRIME (Receiving Stolen Property, Breach of Trust, Cheating, FICN & Kidnapping for Ransom): Only two cases of cheating were registered during the month under review.

5. STATE PREVALENT CRIME/INCIDENTS (Human Trafficking, Drug Abuse, Vehicle Accidents & Suicides): The total number of State Prevalent Crime/Incidents registered during the month of DECEMBER, 2011 was 37. State Prevalent Crime/Incidents cases have shown a downward trend as depicted in the figure below :-



6. NEW AGE CRIME/CYBER CRIME: No case under this head was registered during the month of DECEMBER.

7. CRIME ANALYSIS: Nothing significant to report.

8. FOREIGNERS ACT CASES: No case registered under the Foreigners Act during DECEMBER, 2011.

9. INVESTIGATION PROGRESS: During the month under review 35 numbers of cases were disposed off by the police of which 29 (82.85%) cases were chargesheeted and 06 cases final reported. The number of cases pending investigation is 195 of which 40 are pending investigation over a year (32 cases with Vigilance PS). The main reason for the long pendency is due to non-receipt of CFSL report & prosecution sanction.

10. COURT DISPOSAL: Total number of cases disposed by the court during DECEMBER, 2011 was 35 out of which 21 ended in conviction and 14 in acquittal giving a conviction rate of 60 %.
